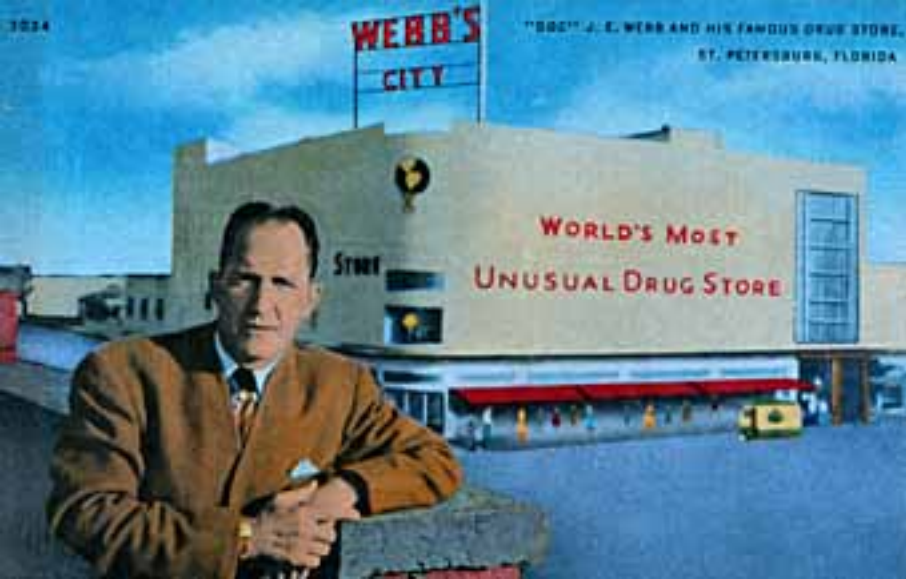

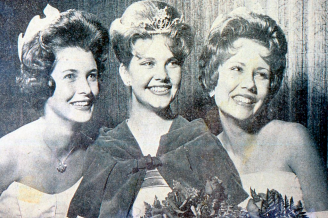

Music formed the centerpiece into the school auditorium and two exercises were

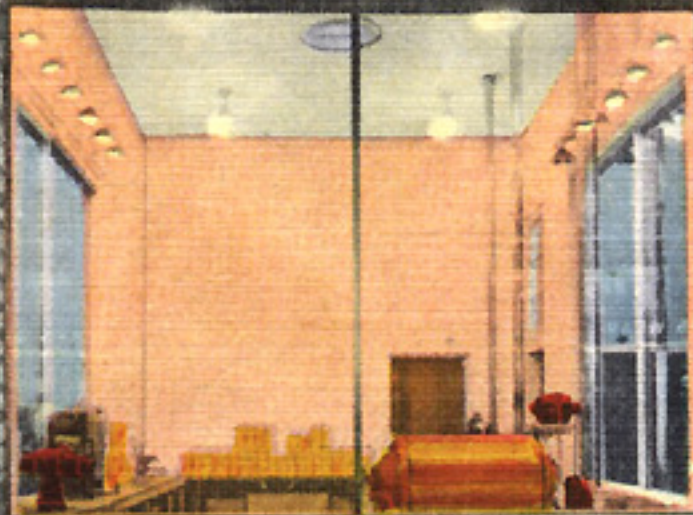

SEXTON THEN ROSE, introduced the class of '65, and reminded, "If I had to select one class over my 11 years here to go out with, this would be the one."

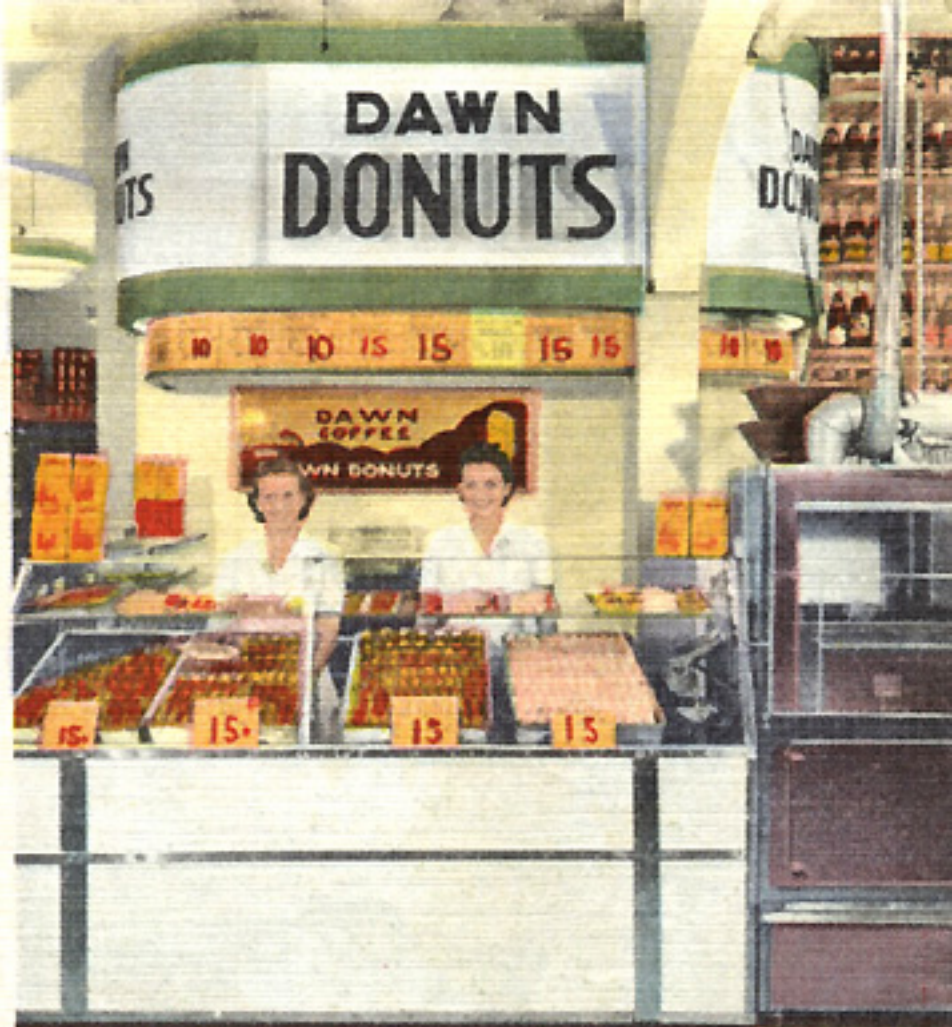
The class addresses were given by Leslie Anne Cope and Dixie Masters. Both spoke of high achievement. The school exercises

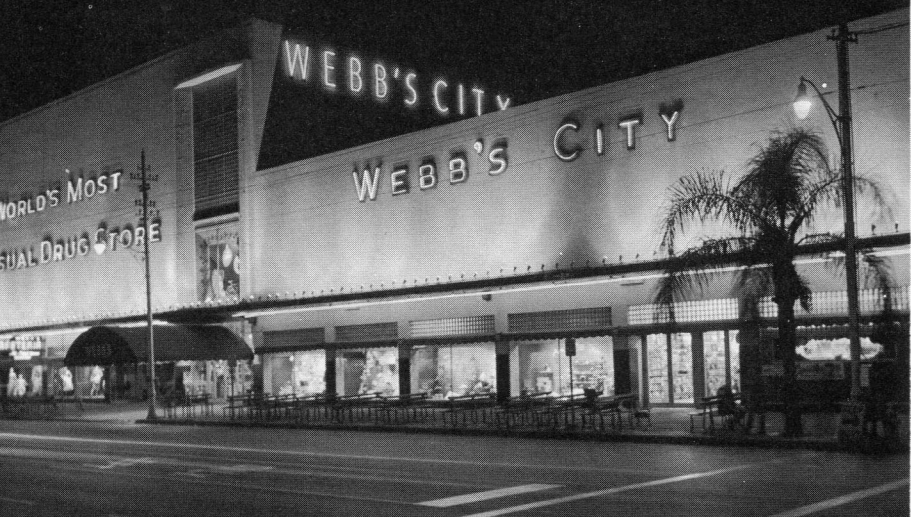

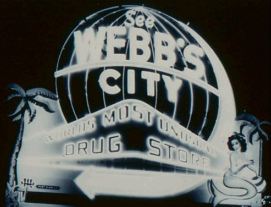

the typical exercises of a physical education class.

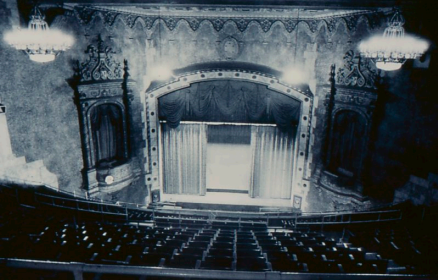
